SCHOOL OF BIBLICAL COUNSELING

RELIGIOUS MASTER OF BIBLICAL COUNSELING (RMBC)

The Religious Master of Biblical Counseling (RMBC) degree program is designed to prepare students for the specialized ministry of Christian counseling in the contexts of the local church, or church-related agencies. The program enables students to thoughtfully integrate and ethically implement the most effective models and theories of Christian counseling with a coherent Biblical/theological perspective and sensitivity to the Holy Spirit's activity. Since helping hurting people is an essential element of the gospel, this program equips students to therapeutically respond to the opportunities of global diversity in facilitating healing and wholeness in all areas of life. Three specialization areas in the RMBC degree are offered:

- 1) R.M. in Biblical Counseling with a concentration in Marital and Family Therapy (preparation for the Certified Christian Marital and Family Therapist, CCMFT).
- R.M. in Biblical Counseling with a concentration in Addictions and Drug Counseling (preparation for the Certified Additions and Drug Counsellor for Christians, CADCC).
- 3) R.M. in Biblical Counseling with a concentration in Pastoral Counseling.

All three specializations share the same common core, SCUTS distinctives and proficiencies, and Biblical and theological foundations courses.

Because students are called to the counseling ministry at all stages of life, no counseling prerequisites are required. The courses within the degree, however, are sequential and need to be completed in a specified order. Advisors guide students in making these selections.

The Religious Master of Biblical Counseling (RMBC) program is not designed to prepare students for professional licensure. RMBC programs are not designed to qualify students or prepare students to meet the licensure requirements for Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC), Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor (LADC), and for Licensed Marital and Family Therapists (LMFT). While licensure requirements vary across States, students are encouraged to contact individual State or national licensing offices to determine if courses completed in this non-academic religious degree program satisfy the requirements to meet their licensure, or if any additional formal academic coursework is required to meet State or a Country's licensure.

Courses completed in the RMBC programs at SCUTS meet the educational requirements for certification in the Certified Christian Marital and Family Therapist (CCMFT) and the Certified Additions and Drug Counsellor for Christians (CADCC) religious, non-academic, vocational certifications provided by St. Christy University of Theology & Seminary to SCUTS Students for ministry training and development at local churches and church-related organizations that recognizes such certifications.

SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY

MASTER OF THEOLOGY (Th. M)

The Master of Theology (Th. M) degree program is designed to equip graduates for effective ministry in the local church, para-church organizations, and other ministry contexts. The degree provides a foundation in ministerial theory and practice that can assist students to pursue ministry vocations. It seeks to develop the essential knowledge and skills for lay positions in the church or specialized professions in both church and community.

Two specializations in the Master of Practical Theology degree are offered:

- 1) Practical Theology (PT)
- 2) Teaching Ministries (TMC)

These options share the same prerequisites, SCUTS distinctives, and Biblical/theological courses.

This degree program prepares leaders by increasing their competence in and understanding of the Word of God through hermeneutical and study skills and by developing a theological framework for their understanding of the teaching of Scripture and for the practices of ministry. In addition to a strong Biblical and theological foundation, the curriculum is flexible enough to meet the demands of both professional and lay positions.

The degree program is structured to provide a strong Biblical/theological/practical ministry foundation for leadership and includes flexibility for students to structure their own programs to meet perceived needs in ministry. The practicum provides supervised practice in church or community contexts that encourage the integration of Biblical and theological understanding with practical ministry strategies.

Applicants for the Master of Theology degree programs should have completed 2 prerequisite courses as listed below in their bachelor's degree programs. Students who have not met this requirement at the time of matriculation must enroll in the required prerequisite courses. These courses should be selected in consultation with the faculty advisor. Credit points from prerequisite courses do apply toward the graduate degree.

MASTER OF BIBLICAL LITERATURE (M. BLit)

The Master of Biblical Literature (M.BLit) degree program is designed to give students hermeneutical and exegetical perspectives, tools, and methods to develop a comprehensive understanding of the Old and New Testament and to interpret Biblical content responsibly and perceptively. This program enables students to integrate hermeneutical and exegetical insights into a theological/historical framework shaped by interaction with the charismatic ethos of St. Christy University of Theology & Seminary. Three concentrations in the M. BLit degree are offered:

- Biblical Literature (BLC)
- Advanced Languages (ALC)
- Judaic-Christian Studies (JCSC)

Students acquire a working knowledge of Biblical languages (Hebrew and Greek). In order to provide students with a knowledge of the theological and historical context in which the Church operates, this program includes a Biblical, theological, and historical studies core.

Proficiency in Biblical Greek and Hebrew is an integral part of this program. Transcript credit and proficiency in both Greek and Hebrew are required for graduation. For students pursuing the literature focus or the Judaic-Christian studies, the first Biblical language is a prerequisite, but the second language is part of the degree program and counts toward fulfilling the degree requirements. For students pursuing the advanced languages concentration, proficiency in both Biblical languages is a prerequisite.

Biblical Literature Prerequisite Courses

Students intending to pursue the Biblical literature program are required to satisfy a minimum of 95 Credit Points of Biblical literature. Those who have not fulfilled this prerequisite requirement in bachelor's degree studies with at least a "B" grade and demonstrated current proficiency (a minimum of 70% on a written examination) may take the following prerequisite/leveling courses to prepare them for the graduate coursework. Credit points from prerequisite courses do apply toward the graduate degree.

SCHOOL OF DIVINITY

MASTER OF DIVINITY (M.Div)

The Master of Divinity religious degree is a 140 and 150 Credit Points program structured around field education and the three curricula areas of the Seminary (Biblical Literature, Theological/Historical Studies and Practices of Ministry). Students are required to enroll in two sessions of field education after 50% of their coursework is complete. Preparatory courses are offered and provided to all students to bridge deficient areas or enhance areas of interest, including Biblical literature, and theological/historical studies. Because SCUTS also has graduate programs in Christian education and Ministry business, students may choose to use a limited number of these elective credit points for cross-disciplinary training.

Two specializations in the M. Div religious degree are offered:

- 1) Master of Divinity with in-depth studies in Practices of Ministry (M.Div/PM)
- 2) Master of Divinity with a concentration in Pastoral Care and Chaplaincy (M. Div/PCHC)
